Letter from the Director

The Edward Blank YIVO Vilna Collections Project, launched in 2014, recently announced the discovery of 170,000 pages of materials—diaries, memoirs, rabbinical writings, literary manuscripts, communal registers, artworks, plays, and many other kinds of works. This discovery and the larger Project is the work of many friends: those of the Paper Brigade dedicated to saving the remnant of Jewish culture in the Vilna Ghetto during the Holocaust; those now working together on what

was saved in Vilnius and New York; those who support this work both financially and in innumerable other ways; and those who are in the growing community of YIVO worldwide. Usually overlooked, friendship is often at the heart of why from hour to hour and day to day we carry on with the ordinary tasks that can become extraordinary, such as the incredible heroism of the Paper Brigade. In another act of supreme friendship Antanas Ulpis, Head of the Lithuanian Book Chamber, who was not a Jew and probably knew very few, if any, of the people whose lives he affected, saved YIVO's Vilna Collection from the Soviets in 1948. We honor our friends across generations, across continents, and across the divisions that often separate us.

Study Tours of Eastern Europe

Karen Underhill Joins YIVO Board

Karen Underhill is Assistant Professor of Polish Literature and Polish Jewish Studies at the University of Illinois at Chicago Department of Slavic and Baltic Languages and Literatures, and a member of the board of Chicago YIVO Society. Her research at the intersection of Polish and Jewish cultures and literatures focuses on Polish and Yiddish modernisms; Bruno Schulz and Galician Jewish culture in the interwar period; and changing narratives of Poland as a multilingual and pluralist space of encounter. She received her PhD in Polish



and Jewish Studies at the University of Chicago in 2011, was YIVO's 2012-2013 Joseph Kremen Memorial Fellow; and is co-founder of Massolit Books & Cafe in Kraków. She has designed Jewish heritage educational programs and teacher training workshops for the Taube Center for the Renewal of Jewish Life in Poland, and continues to lecture in Poland during the summers on Jewish culture and history of Poland.

YIVO Hosts Press Conference on New Discoveries of the Edward Blank YIVO Vilna Collections Project

In May 2017, YIVO discovered in Vilnius, Lithuania, more than 170,000 new documents lost to history for over 70 years and thought to have been destroyed by the Nazis during the Holocaust. These rare and unpublished works represent the collective memory and cultural history of East European Jews. The Vilna Collections now encompass over two million book pages and more than a million pages of literary manuscripts, memoirs, diaries, communal records, religious sermons, letters and other materials. In just three years, YIVO has raised \$5.4 of the \$5.6 million towards this landmark preservation and digitization project.

On October 24th, 2017, YIVO held a press conference announcing this discovery. YIVO Executive Director Jonathan Brent, Dani Dayan, Consul General of Israel in New York, David Fishman, Professor of Jewish History at The Jewish Theological Seminary, Jack Jacobs, professor of political science at John Jay College and the Graduate Center, City University of New York, Rolandas Kriščiūnas, Ambassador of Lithuania to the United States and Mexico, Linas Linkevičius, Lithuanian Minister of Foreign Affairs, and Dainius Ulpis spoke at the press conference. The conference and discoveries were picked up by AP, *The New York Times*, JTA, and other local and international broadcast, print, and online media.

An "Evening of Music" at the Home of Navah Perlman and Robert Frost

Last November, Navah Perlman and Robert Frost hosted an intimate "Evening of Music" fundraiser targeted to new and younger audiences. Jonathan Brent gave a presentation about YIVO's history, mission, and current initiatives. The musical program offered performances by pianist Navah Perlman, vocal duets in English and Yiddish by Leora Perlman and cantor Meredith Greenberg, and a unique musical program of classical music numbers performed by the students of The Julliard School. Many Abraham Joshua Heschel School parents attended and we made some new friends for YIVO.

■ YIVO-Bard Winter Program on Ashkenazi Civilization

This January, over 100 students attended YIVO's Winter Program on Ashkenazi Civilization, which featured eight courses spanning a broad range of topics, from Jewish literature, music, and theater to Jewish politics and history. The Winter Program offers an integrated curriculum in the culture, history, languages, and literatures of East European Jews and the Jewish Diaspora. This year's theme was "Madness & Tyranny," with courses taught by leading academics and artists, including Jonathan Brent, Anthony Coleman, David Fishman, Stefanie Halpern, Jack Jacobs, Annie Polland, Jan Schwarz, Michael Walzer, and John Zorn.



BARBARA KIRSHENBI ATT-GIMBI ETT PRESENTING YIVO STAFE WITH HER EATHER'S LITHOGRAPH

The YIVO Archives Art Collection has recently been enriched by a fascinating donation. Prof. Barbara Kirshenblatt-Gimblett of NYU and the POLIN Museum in Poland donated a beautiful Purim lithograph by her father, Mayer Kirshenblatt. The lithograph is a black and white rendition of Mayer Kirshenblatt's colorful Purim painting, featured on the cover of his wellknown book, They Called Me Mayer July: Painted Memories of a Jewish Childhood in Poland Before the Holocaust that he co-authored with his daughter Barbara (Berkeley and Los Angeles: University of California Press, 2007). Kirshenblatt, who possessed a remarkable visual memory, recreated the Purim scene and story around it exactly as he remembered it from his childhood in Opatów: a well-to-do aged couple from his community and their foster child visited by a group of purimshpilers and klezmer musicians looking forward to a generous reward for their performance. The lithograph represents the same scene slightly differently, changing the family's positioning for a more dramatic contrast between the joyful purimshpilers and slightly gloomy, though warm atmosphere of the house.



The Book Smugglers

(OCTOBER 10, 2017) David Fishman's newest book, The Book Smugglers, chronicles a little-known chapter from the darkest days of Jewish history: the story of the courageous Jews of the "Paper Brigade," who risked their lives to rescue thousands of rare books and manuscripts—from the Nazis and the Soviets—by hiding them on their bodies, burying them in bunkers in the Vilna Ghetto, and smuggling them across borders.

120th Anniversary of the Founding of the Jewish Labor Bund

(OCTOBER 22, 2017) YIVO commemorated the 120th anniversary of the founding of the Jewish Labor Bund, the socialist movement which has figured so prominently in the history of East European and world Jewry. Participants included Hinde Ena Burstin, Jack Jacobs, Clare Kinberg, Irena Klepfisz, Zalmen Mlotek, Avram Patt, Moishe Rosenfield, Daniel Soyer, David Slucki, Ann Toback, Alex Weiser, and Marvin Zukerman.

Jews In and After the 1917 Russian Revolution

(NOVEMBER 5-6, 2017) YIVO's sold out two-day conference explored the context of and immediate reaction to the Revolution, Jewish life in the Soviet Union, and the Revolution's lasting impact today. A Yiddish Liederabend — An Evening of Yiddish Song

(DECEMBER 13, 2017) An elegant, nostalgic program devoted to treasures of Yiddish song, presented in the intimate chamber music setting of a traditional Liederabend (song evening). The concert featured four of the genre's leading interpreters: Ida Rae Cahana, Elizabeth Shammash, Raphael Frieder, Simon Spiro, and a cameo appearance by Robert Paul Abelson, together with world-renowned virtuoso pianist Yehudi Wyner. Neil Levin, YIVO's Anne E. Leibowitz Visiting Professor-in-Residence in Music, delivered a pre-concert lecture. The range of music, poetry, and expression was a testament to the versatility of this genre, and the sold-out event is evidence of the appeal of Yiddish song and poetry today.
